Introduction: a visit to the throne in Isaiah 6

1. Jesus' infinitely better glory is plain, v3
 - a. The brightness of His glory
 - b. The express image of His person
 - c. Upholding all things by the word of His power
 - d. By Himself purged our sins
 - e. Sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high
2. Jesus' infinitely better glory is prophetic, v4-13
 - a. v5a, Psalm 2:7. The eternally begotten King.
 - b. v5b, 2Samuel 7:14. The beloved Son King.
 - c. v6, Psalm 97:7. The terrifyingly glorious King.
 - d. v7, Psalm 104:4. The King over angels, creation, and the flood.
 - e. v8-9, Psalm 45:6-7. The human King who is also God.
 - f. v10-12, Psalm 102:25-27. The LORD Creator King.
 - g. v13, Psalm 110:1. The King whom God seats and serves.

Conclusion: Jesus' infinitely better glory is polarizing, v14. Jesus' enemies are being prepared for destruction, but His friends are being prepared for salvation. Which are you?
